### Thank you for your help!

In March Family Support organized a mini food drive. The team worked with Market Basket in Lee for a food order. Individuals from the Crosby Community Office helped Family Support staff organize the food into 80 bags. The CCO team distributed the bags in groups of ten to Family Support, Early Supports & Services, IHS/PDMS, Case Management and the four day programs. Funding from the Lend a Helping Can/radio station donations supported this initiative.





### In Home Supports

In Home Supports (IH5) is a Medicaid Waivered program available to eligible individuals with a developmental disability ages 3-21 years old who live at home with their families and require extensive supports to live at home. In addition to the need for respite, families and individuals need more support at home as well as involvement in the community to sustain a higher quality of life.

This waivered program is managed by a Family Representative and provides funding opportunities for community integration, personal care support in and outside of the home, assistance with environmental modifications, assistive technology, and much more

Our program works closely to meet the needs of families and individuals, while also staying within state and program regulations. To be found eligible for this program, the individual receiving services must live at home and receive Medicaid. # Open house at Spectrum Connection



We moved!! Spectrum Connection has moved into our amazing new space at 353 High Street in Somersworth We celebrated this with our open house and ribbon cutting ceremony on April 11, 2024 The Spectrum Connection team enjoyed introducing ourselves to the community, providing tours, and talking about how we help individuals with autism spectrum disorder through Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA). The event was well attended by members of the community, families, Community Partners' Board of Directors, and Community Partners' staff. Kids had fun playing with a variety of different toys, reading books, swinging, and jumping in the ball pit. New families interacted with some of our current families to share their experiences with Spectrum Connection, autism, and ABA.

Spectrum Connection provides Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA) to children with autism spectrum disorder from two years of age to eight years of age. We are a fee-for-service provider for children with behavioral challenges or developmental needs. Our services are typically funded by private insurance or Medicaid. Individualized programs are developed based on each learner's specific needs.

We focus on increasing behaviors that are helpful and decreasing behaviors that are harmful or severely impact learning. All interventions are individualized to the learner, and we emphasize teaching skills in a natural, fun environment. We can teach academic, social, communication, and daily living skills in ways that will have a direct, positive impact on the learner and their family.

# What is Project SEARCH?

Project SEARCH is a 9-month work training program for young adults with developmental and physical disabilities. Through a total workplace immersion, Project SEARCH facilitates a seamless combination of classroom instruction, career exploration, on-the-job training, and assistance pursuing entry-level placements.

The goal for each student is competitive, integrated employment.

Project SEARCH Seacoast NH is located at Portsmouth Regional Hospital and is one of five programs of its kind in NH. Community Partners, Portsmouth Regional Hospital, One Sky Community Services, and NH Vocational Rehabilitation collaborate to provide this unique opportunity to the NH seacoast region.
